Roof Deck Protection

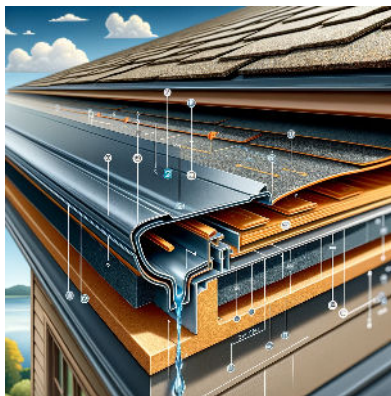
Roof deck protection is a layer that shields against wind-driven rain that could slip under the shingles, preventing water from entering the home.

The metal drip edge is a crucial component that channels water away from the roof's edges. It also contributes to a neat and finished appearance for the roof's perimeter.



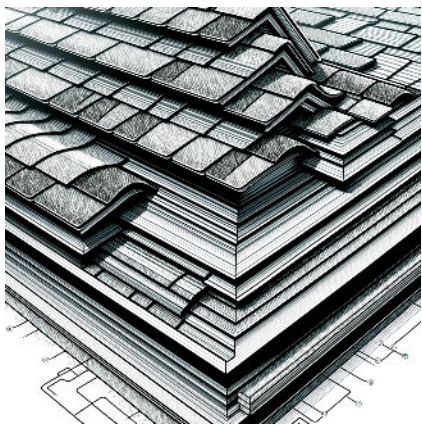
Starter Strips

Shingles

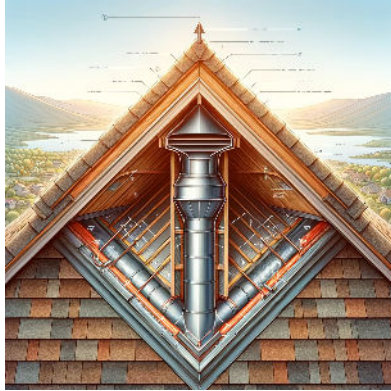
Shingles act as the primary barrier against elements and cover the bulk of the roof surface. They come in various materials and styles, providing protection and aesthetic appeal.

This ventilation is crucial for preventing damage and maintaining a comfortable temperature in the home.

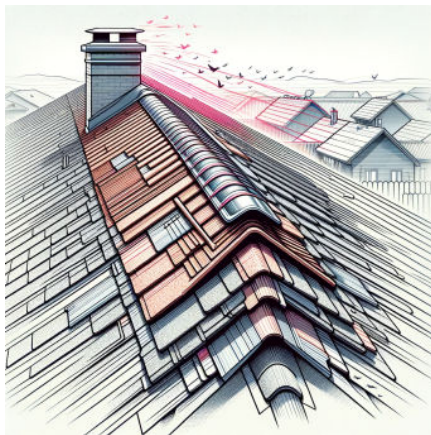


Ridge Cap Shingle
